What is the Japan Grandonnée?

According to the official website of Audax Japan:

"Japan Grandonnée" is a coined term from "Japan Grand Randonnee," meaning "Japan's great little journey." It is a representative RM (Randonneurs Mondiaux) ride in Japan, promoted globally with the aim of continuous annual organization.

The Japan Grandonnée designation was given by Audax Japan to this RM hosted by Audax Japan Hokkaido.

[Rules]

1. Basic Provisions

- This event follows the RM (Randonneurs Mondiaux) regulations and conforms to BRM/AJ regulations. Please ensure you have read and understood the rules: https://www.randonneursmondiaux.org/49-Regulations.html (Revised on July 9, 2025) https://www.audax-japan.org/brevet/brm/brm-part-regulation/

- You must agree to the separate "Participant Liability, Risk Assumption, and Waiver of Compensation and Rights" document and sign the form provided by the organizer at checkin.

- Obey all traffic laws. Disqualification may occur if violations such as running red lights are observed or reported.

- In the event of an accident or injury, report it to the organizer or staff, but handle it independently. AJ Hokkaido is not responsible for any accidents during this event.

2. Mandatory Equipment

- Front Lights (at least 2 required; spare lights recommended)

- Must be fixed to the bicycle frame.
- Helmet-mounted lights do not count as primary front lights.
- Must be permanently mounted and functional at all times.
- Lights must be turned on from dusk to dawn, in tunnels, during fog/rain, and in poor

visibility.

• Every rider must turn on their lights even in group riding.

- Rear Light (at least 1 required)

• Must be securely mounted on the frame or seat post.

• At least one of the rear lights must be in steady (non-flashing) mode. (Revised on July 7, 2025)

- Reflective Gear (required on upper body)

• Wear a reflective vest or equivalent garment with reflective material visible from front and back.

• Must be worn not only at night but also during the day (local AJ Hokkaido rule).

• Reflective sashes alone are not allowed (local AJ Hokkaido rule).

- Helmet (required)

• Required under traffic laws and insurance conditions (AJ regulation).

- Bell (required)

• Required under traffic laws and insurance conditions (AJ regulation).

- Helmet Rear Light (required)

• Improves visibility from behind. Flashing mode is allowed.

3. Recommended Equipment

- Helmet-mounted light: useful for reading signs, cue sheets, and maps, and for roadside repairs.

- Ankle Reflectors * Recommended according to LRM Rules 2023, section 3.8 (Revised on July 7, 2025)"

- Emergency (survival) blanket: useful for cold weather or emergency rest situations.

[Course Navigation]

- Follow the route using the cue sheet and pass through each PC (control point) in order.

- PC open/close times are not required for certification but serve as a pacing guide.

- Staffed PCs are staffed only during their designated time. If passing during unattended hours, riders must prove passage themselves (e.g., take a photo with your bike and a landmark using a smartphone).

- Receipt Check: PC3, PC4, PC10, PC12, PC13, PC14

• These are convenience store checkpoints. Make a purchase and submit the receipt at the next staffed PC or at the finish. Lost receipts may result in disqualification.

- Staff Check: Start, PC1, PC2, PC5, PC6, PC7, PC8, PC9, PC11, Goal (some use ticket machines).

- Leaving the route for shopping or repairs is not prohibited, but you must return to the same spot before rejoining the official route.

[Drop Bags]

1. Drop-off & Delivery

- (1) From Registration (Kanamoto Hall) \rightarrow PC5/PC9 (Kitami Center)
- Drop off at registration on August 10.
- Receive a luggage tag with your entry number, attach it to your bag, and submit to staff by 16:00.
- Payment and shipping label for return can be completed here. Accepted: cash, QR (PayPay, Rakuten Pay, etc.), or Credit card. Please note that return shipments are limited to cash-ondelivery (COD) only.
- If using a cardboard box, write your name clearly and attach the tag with tape.
- You may also pre-ship your luggage to PC5 using courier service. Ensure delivery by the morning of August 11 (prepaid only).

- Note: Drop bags are NOT accepted at the start venue.

(2) From PC5/PC9 \rightarrow via courier to your desired destination within Japan (excluding the event goal site)

- Submit your return items at PC5 or PC9 during their operating hours. Destinations may include the finish venue, your home, or hotel in Sapporo.

- PC9 final drop-off deadline: August 13 (Wed) at 17:00.

2. Retrieval

(1) At PC5/PC9: Show brevet card or tag during their open hours.

(2) At Goal: Available between August 13, 23:00 – August 15, 0:30. Early DNF riders must retrieve bags during this time. Organizers will not ship bags to your home.

3. Rules of baggage size

- 1 item per person, up to 200 cm (total length of sides), 30 kg max. Prepare your own box/bag.

- Securely packed to avoid item loss. No compensation for damage/loss.

- No fragile or valuable items. Manage valuables personally.

[Regarding Baggage Storage at the Start Venue]

- As a general rule, baggage storage will **not** be provided at the start/goal venue (Okadama Fureai Center Wa-no-Yakata).
- However, in exceptional cases (e.g., when your hotel cannot store luggage or you are unable to send it via courier), we may store your baggage during the event **free of charge**. This service is only for those who fully understand and accept the following conditions.
- We accept **no responsibility or claims** for any damage, loss, or issues involving the contents or the exterior of stored baggage.
- When depositing your baggage, please write your **entry number and name** clearly on the luggage tag. As the process must be done in a short time before the start, your cooperation for a quick and smooth check-in is appreciated.
- Pick-up is only available at the finish venue, during its open hours.
- **Even in the case of withdrawal**, baggage must be picked up at the finish venue.
- No baggage will be accepted at the registration venue (Kanamoto Hall) on the previous day.

[Support and Retirement]

1. Support Policy

- Riders must be self-sufficient. No support from non-participants (vehicles, bicycles, etc.) during the ride is allowed.

- Support from third parties is only allowed at official checkpoints.
- Unplanned assistance (e.g., from other riders or bike shops) is permitted.

2. Retirement and Incidents

- In case of retirement, accident, illness, finish time over, or lost receipt, contact staff immediately via email (muto@mbc.nifty.com).

- Riders are responsible for managing their own transportation if they retire.

- Staff will not recover participants or bicycles.

[Event Cancellation Policy]

- The organizer may cancel the event due to bad weather or other unavoidable circumstances. No specific timing will be set in advance.

- Cancellation may occur even after the event starts.

- Continuing the event does not guarantee rider safety. Riders must decide whether to pause or stop based on their own judgment.

- Entry fees will not be refunded, even if the event is canceled.

3. Procedure:

(1) Confirm your starting group (approx. 40 riders per wave; grouped at 10-min intervals).

(2) Receive brevet card and luggage tag; fill out required information (bring a pen).

(3) Drop off your drop bag and pay for return shipping.

(4) AJ Hokkaido 20th Anniversary Pin Badges available for 1,000 yen.

(5) Overseas participants: collect commemorative jerseys ordered in advance.

X Riders may still start within 1 hour after their assigned time.

[Important Notes During the Ride]

- At convenience stores and other facilities, be mindful not to disturb other customers.
- Please act respectfully so that we, as randonneurs, are accepted by society.
- Absolutely no littering. Riders are responsible for their own conduct.
- Watch out for road hazards such as bumps or depressions.

- Even during warm daytime hours, nights and early mornings can be very cold. Prepare adequate cold-weather gear.

[About the Medals]

The following three types of medals are available for finishers of the Japan Grandonnee: - 1. **AJ Hokkaido 1200km Original Medal**: Provided free of charge. (Given to all finishers, including those who finish outside official finish hours. Will be sent by mail at a later date.)

- 2. **RM Medal**: 1,000 yen (Optional; must be applied for during the finish procedure. Will be sent by mail at a later date.)

- 3. **AJ 20th Anniversary Commemorative Medal**: 2,000 yen (Optional; can be purchased during the finish procedure and will be handed out on the spot.)

[Liability Waiver and Release Agreement]

As a participant in an event hosted by Audax Japan Hokkaido, I, on behalf of myself, my heirs, and close relatives, agree to the following:

1. I understand the nature of long-distance cycling events and confirm that I am in good health and physically fit to participate. I agree to cease participation immediately if I determine that continuing poses a risk to my safety.

2. I acknowledge the event is held on public roads, with inherent risks. I agree to obey all traffic laws and signals. I will also withdraw from the event if I judge the weather or conditions to be unsafe.

3. I understand:

(a) Cycling events involve the risk of serious injury, including permanent disability, paralysis, or death.

(b) Such risks may arise from my own actions, actions of others, conditions of the event, or negligence of third parties.

(c) Additional risks, including social and economic losses, may occur unexpectedly. I accept full responsibility for all such risks, losses, and damages.

4. I release and waive any claims against Audax Japan, its organizers, volunteers, and venue owners from all liability, damages, or demands related to the event. If any claims are brought against these parties on my behalf, I agree to indemnify and hold them harmless.

5. I consent to receive medical treatment deemed necessary during the event and accept full financial responsibility for such treatment.

6. I grant permission for my name, voice, photographs, or video footage taken during the event to be used in media, websites, or promotional materials without compensation.

7. I understand that the participation fee will not be refunded if the event is canceled due to weather or unavoidable circumstances.

8. I confirm that I have valid insurance as required by the organizer and will provide accurate policy details. If the event schedule changes, I will ensure that my insurance remains valid.

By signing this waiver, I acknowledge that I am waiving significant rights. I affirm this

agreement is made voluntarily and without reliance on any representations or guarantees. If any portion of this waiver is deemed invalid, the remainder shall continue in full force and effect.
